## The first meeting of the second edition The Youth Council for Government Talents discusses the future of "Human Resources"

It is noteworthy that in conjunction with the International Youth Day, which falls on August 12, the Federal Authority for Government Human Resources, in cooperation with the Federal Youth Authority, launched the new formation of the Youth Council for Government Talents, with the aim of supporting young government talents and involving them in designing the future of talents, creating proactive policies, and developing the government human capital system based on the visions, aspirations, and ideas of young people.

The Council's objectives consist in amplifying the supportive and enabling environment for young talents in the federal government, participating in designing future human resources policies in the federal government, and innovating proactive solutions and initiatives to design the future of work in the federal government.
